### Federal Suitability And Security Clearances

About 3 million jobs require a security clearance and over 800,000 investigations and reinvestigations are conducted each year. 2. Federal Employment Suitability and Fitness regulations require all federal employees and contractor applicants for Public Trust positions be investigated and receive favorable suitability or fitness determinations. About 400,000 investigations are conducted a year for this purpose.

### Federal Suitability/Security Clearance Chart

The security clearance level depends on the type of access to classified information and secure facilities that you'll need to perform your job. For jobs that require a security clearance, you'll need to provide at least 10 years of personal information and maybe more. You'll need to complete the Standard Form 86 (SF86).

### What are background checks and security clearances? - USAJobs

Only the federal government grants a security clearance to an individual after the federal government completes the individual's background investigation, and the individual meets federal government character and trustworthiness standards ( EO 12968 Sec. 3.1 (b) ). A person may be deemed suitable for work for the federal government and not be granted a security clearance.

### FEDERAL SECURITY / SUITABILITY CLEARANCE CHART

Executive Order grants the Council the: (1) authority over the information systems used for security clearance processing, and (2) authority to issue policies ensuring the uniformity of suitability and security processes, or "aligned systems" as described in Section 2.1 of the Executive Order.

### Introduction to the Federal Security Clearance Process

Depending on their mission and role in national security, many federal agencies require security clearances. Only federal agencies can grant security clearances. Examples of agencies that may require higher levels of clearance include: Intelligence community (e.g., Central Intelligence Agency, National Security Agency)

The Personnel Security and Suitability Program responsibilities and procedural requirements for investigations, suitability adjudications, security clearance determinations, and appeals of GSA employees, applicants, appointees, volunteers, and affiliates, are all updated. ### Personnel Security and Suitability Program Handbook | GSA

Security clearances only apply to positions that fall under the purview of the federal government. Executive Order 12968, Access to Classified Information, provides that security clearances are only granted to persons employed by, detailed or assigned to, or working on behalf of the federal government.

Suitability Standards and Criteria 5 CFR 731.201 and 202 • A suitability action taken against an applicant, appointee, or employee will protect the integrity or promote the efficiency of the service • Suitability determinations must be based on the presence or absence of one or more specific factors (charges)

When that occurs, the suitability/fitness determination is usually made first, and if it is unfavorable, the case is never adjudicated for security clearance eligibility. Understanding the Security Clearance Lingo. The wording used by different agencies can also be confusing. Rarely is the term, "security clearance," used in official documents.

### Due Process For Denying or Revoking Security Clearance ...

Security clearances can be issued by many United States of America government agencies, including the Department of Defense (DoD), the Department of State (DOS), the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), the Department of Energy (DoE), the Department of Justice (DoJ), the National Security Agency (NSA), and the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). DoD issues more than 80% of all clearances.

Confidential clearances are issued to federal employees that have access to information that could reasonably be expected to cause potential damage to national security if disclosed to unauthorized individuals. A Confidential clearance is similar, in some respects, to a public trust position or public trust clearance.

SECURITY vs SUITABILITY . A security clearance investigation is an inquiry into an individual's loyalty, character, trustworthiness and reliability to ensure that he or she is eligible for access to national security information. "The Director of National Intelligence shall serve as the Security Executive Agent.

**Security vs Suitability - dni.gov**

Employment suitability and security clearance criteria are very similar, but a few differences exist. One major difference is that suitability criteria can be influenced by the nature of the position for which you are applying, whereas security criteria is unaffected by the nature of the position.
