If we look at each program individually, Medicare spending grew 6.4% to \$750.2 billion in 2018, or 21% of total NHE, while Medicaid spending grew 3% to \$597.4 billion in 2018, or 16% of total NHE.

### The Sad Anniversary of Medicare and Medicaid - The Future ...

Pursuant to a congressional request, GAO reviewed the effects of major legislative changes after 1980 on: (1) Medicare and Medicaid program costs; and (2) program beneficiaries' costs. GAO found that, since a number of interrelated factors affected overall Medicare program costs, it could not quantify changes in costs solely attributable to the major legislative changes.

**Understanding Medicaid Hospital Payments and the Impact of ...**

The General Accounting Office reviewed the effects of major legislative changes on Medicare and Medicaid program costs and the out-of-pocket costs to the programs' beneficiaries. Of 30 laws that affected Medicare and Medicaid enacted by Congress during the period 1980 through 1986, 5 were estimated to have the greatest effects on the costs of the two programs.

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
